I GRADUATED FROM DETROIT LAKES HIGH SCHOOL AND CONCORDIA COLLEGE WITH A DEGREE IN HOME ECONOMICS. MY FIRST JOB WAS TEACHING IN PERHAM WHILE JOHN WAS SERVING OUR COUNTRY. IN 1971 JOHN AND I GOT JOBS TEACHING IN PELICAN RAPIDS WHERE I TAUGHT FOR 32 YEARS UNTIL 2005. JUDY TABBUT AND I WERE HIRED THE SAME YEAR, SO WE SPENT 32 YEARS TEACHING HOME ECONOMICS TOGETHER.

PELICAN WAS A GREAT PLACE TO LIVE AND TEACH. I LOVED THE VARIETY OF TEACHING GRADES 7 - 12 STUDENTS AND THE LEVELS AND CHALLENGES IN LEARNING. THE MANY DIFFERENT CULTURES PROVIDED ME WITH MANY LEARNING EXPERIENCES OF MY OWN, AND IT WAS ENJOYABLE TO LEARN ABOUT DIFFERENT CULTURES.

THE MEMORIES KEEP COMING BACK. TEACHING KIDS HOW TO THREAD THE SEWING MACHINE ONE HOUR, AND THEN GUIDING OLDER STUDENTS SEWING A QUILT OR MAKING A PIECE OF CLOTHING THE

NEXT HOUR. SOMETIMES THE KIDS GOT MARRIED AND LEARNED ABOUT HOW TO LIVE IN THIS WORLD: WRITE A CHECK, FIND AN APARTMENT, AND PLAN A BUDGET. SOMETIMES THE KIDS LEARNED ABOUT CARING FOR BABIES BY TAKING CARE OF A 5 LB. BAG OF FLOUR OR IN LATER YEARS AN ACTUAL MECHANICAL BABY THAT WOULD CRY WHEN IT NEEDED CARE (THIS INCLUDED CHANGING A DIAPER). SOME YEARS I GUIDED STUDENTS AS THEY WENT TO THE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TO WORK IN CLASSROOMS AND LEARN ABOUT YOUNGER BEHAVIORS AND LEARNING. IT WAS LEARNING BASIC TO ADVANCED LIFETIME SKILLS. AND IN THE JUNIOR HIGH CLASSES THERE WAS LEARNING TO COOK, SETTING THE TABLE AND CLEANING UP THE DISHES. NEVER A DULL MOMENT IN HOME ECONOMICS CLASSES.

IN RETIREMENT WE MOVED TO LAKE 7 BY VERGAS WHERE I CONTINUE MY HOBBIES OF QUILTING AND SCRAPBOOKING. WE ALSO CONTINUE TO TRAVEL THE U.S. AND REMAIN ACTIVE AT TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH AND WITH THE FRIENDS OF MAPLEWOOD STATE PARK. TEACHING WAS A GOOD, FUN, AND FULFILLING CAREER. THANK YOU PELICAN RAPIDS.

I GRADUATED FROM PELICAN RAPIDS HIGH SCHOOL IN 1967. AFTER GRADUATING FROM NDSU WITH A DEGREE IN HOME ECONOMICS, I STARTED TEACHING IN PELICAN RAPIDS IN 1971 AND RETIRED IN 2006. I WAS GRATEFUL TO MR. MARTIN FOR HIRING ME AS THERE WAS A SURPLUS OF TEACHERS AT THAT TIME. IN THE EARLY 70'S WE ASKED SOME GUYS TO TAKE A COOKING CLASS; AFTER THAT HOME ECONOMICS HAD LOTS OF GUYS. IN RETIREMENT I HAVE HELPED WITH GATHERING SCHOOL SUPPLIES FOR STUDENTS, AND I AM A PARTNER IN MERCANTILE ON MAIN. I HAVE ENJOYED TRAVELING AND SPENDING WINTERS IN ARIZONA.
